Focus Area: Phonological Awareness

Phonological Awareness is one of The Five Big Ideas for Teaching Reading. Phonological awareness refers to the awareness of and being able to hear and manipulate the sounds used in our language. Phonological awareness is about what a child can hear and has nothing to do with print. Phonological awareness ability is one of the best predictors of whether children will become successful readers. It is essential to learning to read in an alphabetical system as it prepares children for sounding out words.

As a school we want to ensure that all our K-2 children develop strong phonological skills so they are on a path to be successful readers. The Early Literacy Screener used with all children in Kindergarten to Year 2 is helping teachers determine the skills your child has mastered and whether there are areas that may require help/

Within the Phase Two NSW Literacy and Numeracy Action Plan (phase 2 Action Plan), teachers have engaged in professional learning that covers the elements of phonological awareness and will be involved in planning and delivering teaching strategies that will develop and enhance children's phonological awareness.
